Centennial Hall

The Centennial Hall is one of the most prominent landmarks in the history of 20th-century architecture. Designed by the eminent architect Max Berg, it was created in 1913 to celebrate the international exhibition commemorating the Battle of the Nations. In 2006, the site was enlisted in the UNESCO World Heritage Register. ↓ check the attractions nearby ↓

Depot History Centre

The heart of the Depot is the main exhibition "Wrocław 1945– 2016" which tells the story of the post-war history of the city and its residents who, having arrived from different parts of Poland and its Borderlands, created the social, cultural and academic fabric of the city from scratch.

It is an island and the oldest part of Wrocław. Surrounded by the River Oder, this former garden, which gave rise to the city of Wrocław, is now featuring a number of monuments.

Platanus x acerifolia is a natural monument with a circumference of 538 and a total height of about 33 m. It is the only monument in Ostrów Tumski located outside the <u>Botanical Garden</u>.




The Dumpling Gate is a stone archway situated to the north of the cathedral, which appears completely normal until you notice the strange stone shape sitting in the middle of it. According to legend, this is a dumpling.



A statue of St Vincent was made by a young boy who once saved the city's master sculptor, who fainted. It turned that the cripple boy was very handicapped while given the chance to sculp. He most very patient and carved the most beautiful legs in the statue. <u>Guess, what happened next.</u>

About 15 meters above the ground, there is a strange stone head, frozen in a silent scream. The head is notable because, as you can see in the picture, it doesn't look as though it should be there or was part of the cathedral's original design. According to legend, this is the head of a young man who fell in love with the daughter of a wealthy goldsmith. Check, how it ended for them.

While strolling around Ostrów Tumski, not everyone knows that Nicolaus Copernicus himself - the most outstanding Polish astronomer - used to live right next to Katedralna 7. Check the mail slot. Maybe, you can still find him there.

Many years ago, there lived on the island two very rich and influential people, Prince Henry and Bishop Thomas. Both men completely hated each other. One day, the two men went to the Archbishop to help settle their dispute. Upon hearing their grievances with each other, the Archbishop advised them that the best way to reconcile their differences would be to build a church

instead. How did they resolve the problem?

11343 John Selected called St Bartholomew's together. The men agreed. While they were John Nepomucen on the church square – its presence in front of Saint Bartholomew church dominates the central plaza. However, look close and you will see something strange about this statue. Hidden among the typical angels depicted on the statue's side are two whose heads are completely bald. 

The Mathematical Tower in the main building of the University. The Museum of the UW have 4 attractions: Aula Leopoldinum, Oratorium Marianum, Exposition and Mathematical Tower. The terrace of the tower is a viewpoint on Słodowa Island and the Old Town. The four statues are allegories of four sciences: Theology, Law, Philosophy and Medicine.

CATHEDRAL OF ST. JOHN BAPTIST

The cathedral is located in Ostrów Tumski district. On the top of the tower there is a viewpoint where it is possible to get with the lift. **Opening hours:** Mon-Sat 10:00-17:00 Sun 14:00-16:00 **Tickets:** 10 PLN / 8 PLN





PENITENT BRIDGE 45 m

The Penitent Bridge (Mostek Pokutnic) is a footbridge between the two towers of Mary Magdalene church at the height of 45 metres. According to the legend, one could see the ghosts of young women, who, instead of taking care of their homes and children, preferred to party with men. As a penitence, they had to cross the

bridge between the towers.

KONS.PIRA RESTAURACJA




