ZOO

The Wrocław Zoo is the oldest and one of the richest in fauna in Poland, featuring animals from every continent and diverse environments, including pavilions dedicated to Madagascar, the Sahara, and Europe. The **Wrocław Afrykarium** is focused solely on African aquatic life.

HYDROPOLIS

Hydropolis, Wrocław's center for environmental education, is one of the largest facilities of its kind in Europe. It is the only center in Poland that showcases nearly all types of aquatic environments. Visitors can explore over 70 interactive features and multimedia installations.

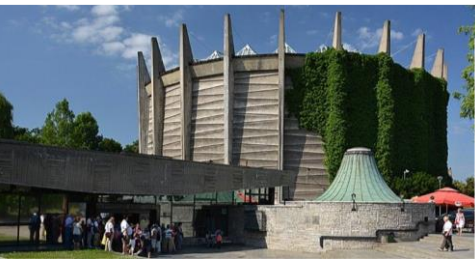

AQUAPARK

Racławice Panorama

The Panorama of Racławice is a monumental cycloramic painting depicting the Battle of Racławice during the Kościuszko Uprising of 1794. Measuring 15 meters high and 114 meters long, this artwork immerses viewers in the dramatic scene with its unique perspective and three-dimensional elements.

Centennial Hall

Centennial Hall is a landmark of 20th-century architecture, designed by the renowned architect Max Berg. Built in 1913 for the international exhibition commemorating the Battle of the Nations, it was designated a UNESCO World Heritage site in 2006.

Depot History Centre

The heart of the Depot is the main exhibition, "Wrocław 1945–2016," which narrates the post-war history of the city and its residents. It highlights how newcomers from various parts of Poland and its borderlands helped to shape the social, cultural, and academic fabric of Wrocław from scratch.

SPIRE (IGLICA)
